## Wigginton named to statewide post

**NEWARK --** David Wigginton, president of the Licking County Board of Developmental Disabilities (LCBDD) recently was elected to fill an at-large seat on the board of trustees for the Ohio Association of County Boards Serving People with Developmental Disabilities (OACB).

The OACB's membership includes all 88 county boards of developmental disabilities. Wigginton was elected to the two-year term by delegates from other county boards at the recent OACB fall conference, held last week in Columbus.

"It's a true testament to Dave," said LCBDD Superintendent Nancy Neely. "He has been very dedicated to our local board for several years. We are proud that he will represent Licking County and the 1,300 people we serve at the state level."

Wigginton is a Newark attorney with Schaller, Campbell & Untied who has a long history of serving local community organizations. He is a current board member of the United Way of Licking County, and past board president of Mental Health America of Licking County.

Wigginton has served on the LCBDD for three years, becoming president nearly one year ago.

The LCBDD provides comprehensive services to individuals with developmental disabilities, and their families. The agency offers early intervention services to babies and toddlers; support services and service coordination to school-age children; adult services at LICCO Inc., located in Heath; residential supports; and transportation services. The LCBDD is nationally accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) for providing high-quality services to individuals with disabilities and their families.
